



The x in Black represents a tract of land situated in Gentry Township, Perry County, containing one hundred acres eighty four perches and allowance of six per cent for roads &c part of 346 <sup>as.</sup> 107 p. or 348 <sup>as.</sup> 109 x allowance.

Originally Surveyed the <sup>4<sup>th</sup> day of May A.D. 1769 to Samuel Lavor and returned into the Land office of Pa (title not known) App'l No. 1008. The above part Surveyed for Simon Shull April 12. 1843 for Patenting
