



A Drought of a tract of Land situated in Mippinose Township Lycoming County Surveyed the 24<sup>th</sup> day May 1811 in pursuance of a warrant granted to George Johnston and by him assigned to Richard Salmon Esq<sup>r</sup>. Dated the 8<sup>th</sup> day of April 1811 Containing Three hundred & nineteen Acres & ninety eight perch and allowance of Six p. Ct for Roads &c -- Returned 2<sup>nd</sup> June 1815 by order from the Surveyor General -- Note the improvements is a house a considerable quantity of land cleared on the above tract -- the part marked A inter. fens with Samuel Crook's Son appl. Surveyd 5<sup>th</sup> Oct. 1773 on application N<sup>o</sup> 355 Dated 3<sup>rd</sup> April 1769 and the part B was Surveyd to Richard Peters Barton 5<sup>th</sup> July 1769 on application N<sup>o</sup> 408
