



A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in Lower Milford Township in the County of Bucks in the State of Pennsylvania. Containing Two Hundred Acres and 60 perches of Land, together with the usual allowance at Six per cent for Roads. That was formerly Surveyed to Peter Niss, by Warrant dated on the 14<sup>th</sup> August Anno 1734. Who soon after sold his Right to the same to George Hungefser, who sold the same again to Daniel Klingensmith and Christian Caspel, who sold the same again to Rudolph Kiteweiler who on the 1<sup>st</sup> March Anno 1757, paid Ten pounds into the Receiver Generals Office as in Part of the Consideration for the same. Who died Anno 1764. Then in the year 1780, the said Plantation and Land was divided to the Heirs of the said deceased Rudolph Kiteweiler into several Tracts. But that Part allotted to the only son, Jacob Kiteweiler, containing 95<sup>ac</sup> 82 p. etc. was Anno 1785, by him sold to Henry Mombower, and the Daughters Mary Elisabeths Share thereof (who had married Daniel Lambrecht,) was by them sold to Valentine Kuber (i. at Koober) etc. and the other Daughters Christina Barbara & Share (who was married to Joseph Leopold lately deceased,) consisting in four Tracts, and containing 67 acres, 76 pms. et allowance is yet possessed by herself, as by the particular Draught for the same will appear. These Three Parties humbly desire that a Patent or Patents be granted to them, by the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Board of the Land Office, formerly Surveyed and divided, for the Heirs of Rudolph Kiteweiler and now Drawn, by order of the Surveyor General on the 18<sup>th</sup> April Anno 1788.
