N: B John Crane who was present at making the above Survey says he was present also at the first Running of it; That the Surveyor began at the Chestnut  
 corner and run the lines agreeably to the above Draught &c But in order to prove the Survey more plainly I caused the Chestnut to be blocked and upon count-  
 ing the growths find it to have been marked 21 years past which appears to agree to the Date of the first Survey and as there is no Chestnut Corner can be found  
 near to Joshua Elders Survey it appears most probable that the one above alluded to is the Real Corner  
 Note also that the part marked A.B. Included within the dotted lines is Claimed by Andrew Bird a Survey of which is Returned into the Surveyor  
 Generals Office and Contains fifty four acres and two tenths Surveyed in pursuance of a Warrant Dated May 9<sup>th</sup> 1794.
