 beg leave to state that the part where the letter B. is placed within the Red lines Being part of a
 Larger tract of 415 1/2^{ac} and allowance of Land which is Claimed by Joseph Reed In Pursuance
 of a Warrant for 400^{ac} Granted to Patrick Ferral bearing date the 1st day of October A.D. 1784. The part B patented
 A.B. at the time of Surveying the above land there was no Improvement thereon - other than
 about 30^{ac} of Cleared Land part where of in Wheat and part in Rye.
