



A General Draught of the Lands in Dispute between the Heirs of Andrew Brown & William Work in Allen Township, Cumberland County, Surveyed the 19th & 20th of Sept. 1803 on an Order of the Board of Property Dated August the 6th 1803.

Note The whole of the Lands ab down contains two hundred & eight ab acres & ³/₄ of an acre.

" The black lines running to and from the Hickory stump is the line that Wm Work says was first run upon the warrant of Hugh Cook & he intends to establish them by the Deposition of John Sands the contain 118^{ac} 24^{rs} & allowance.

" The dotted lines running to and from the Hick stump is the line that Andrew Brown's heirs says was first run on Hugh Cook's warrant & they intend to establish ab lines by the Deposition of Jas' Cummings & contains 159^{ac} 131^{rs}. Having blocked the trees on the black lines & the marks on the trees on the dotted lines appears much the oldest.

" And as to the two lines striking the line of Henry Quigley it is hard to determine ab which of them is the nearest the three Springs a place so called.

" Wm Work & Browns Heirs agrees to the Hick stump being the original corner of Hugh Cook's first survey. The lines S 33 E 114 1/2 & S 39 W 130 represents the survey ab

" The lines colored Yellow represents Thompson's improvement. The letter ab represents where an old improvement had been made. The Land North & West of the Hick stump was vacant at the first executing of Hugh Cook's warrant. And as to the Location of Work I know not where it was laid. Was stopped no lines nor Draught of it.
