



In Pursuance of an Order From the Board of Property Dated the 28th of March 1768 on the 7th of the 3^d Month 1769 I carefully Examined the lines of William Sprinkles Land and find the Lines from the white oak at A to the Black oak at B were actually Run and Marked about Sixteen Years ago and that the other Lines have been Run and Marked about Six Years the Small Piece Marked C is a Piece of Land Michael Troeback Lais Claim to the the Red Lines were Run and Marked at the same time the Survey was closed and No Regard Paid to the Black Lines they Included; and the Most of the Timber that is to support one of Sprinkles Improvements is on the Land Included by the Red Lines I find the whole to be Run and Marked all Round But a Mistake of 26 perches in the N 31. E Line and some small Variations in several other of the Distances as they may see by Comparing this and George Stevensons Draught which I send Herewith and find the Land Included in the Black Lines to be 206 Acres and all
