



The shaded lines in the above diagram represent a Survey made to William Cummings on the 1<sup>st</sup> of June 1775 on Warrant dated 23<sup>rd</sup> July 1773 Situate on a branch of Allegheny Westmoreland County. is found to be on little Mahoning Creek in Mahoning Township in the County of Indiana some miles North of the purchase of 1768 and within the purchase of 1781

The dotted lines in the above diagram represent the new purchase Surveys upon which the land is claimed and held the warrant names the dates and numbers whereof are inserted in the drafts respectively. The Survey of William Cummings includes the improvement of Andrew Gibson who holds under Lease from Mason and Cross.

The above interference ascertained the 17<sup>th</sup> day of May 1828. In pursuance of the Several Acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other office titles issued from or under the Proprietary Government and by the authority from the Board of Property.
