



In pursuance of a Warrant dated December 14th 1785 there was Surveyed for Joseph Workman the above described Tract of Land (comprehended ^{with} on the black lines) containing Two Hundred & forty acres & 74 perches with an allowance proportioned to six p cent situate on the Waters of Turtle Creek in Pitt Township in the County of Westmoreland

N.B. the dotted lines represented as Interfering with the above Draught is a survey made by Peter Light Aug^l 5th 1785 on Warrant of Sept^r 30th 1784 ~~ret~~ returned to y^e Sur^r Gen^l Office by J^r Henderson Dep^t Sur^r for Christ^l Werhold containing 315 Acres & allowance on which it is said Werhold has Obtained a Patent - the land now surveyd to Workman was by me as an Assistant to Rob^t W^m Crea D.S. on the 30th Day of June 1772 Surveyd to John Sanson In pursuance of an Order dated Apl^l 3rd 1769 in the name of Tho^s Faith. W^m Crea sometime after returned an other Survey on the Order in the name of T. Faith and John Sanson sold the Land Surveyd by me to Mich^l Wiffenagle Esq^r Mr. Wiffenagle thinking his Land safe rested secure untill Peter Light came with Werholds Warrant which was taken as is said for Land on Sevierly into my district without my knowledge or consent and made the Survey. Mr. Wiffenagle then on examination found his Land purchased from Sanson not returned, procured a Warrant and Applid to me to make the Survey I did not Incline to do it although I received the Survey made by Peter Light Illegal & Improper untill Mr. Wiffenagle Urged me to make the Survey and state the case and leave the Acceptance or Rejection of it to the Surveyor General this I complied with.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this
