



Situate in Chanceford Township in the County of York Containing in the whole 99^{ac} & 143 perches and the usual allowance of six per cents &c. The Part A. 24^{ac} & 150 p^{erches} & the part B. 71^{ac} & 153 p^{erches} and allowance &c. A. Originally surveyed by William Mathews late D.S. on the 1st Day of the 12th mo. 1786. In pursuance of the Application N^o 4983 for 50^{ac} Granted to J^{no} Mc Kinley bearing date the 16th Day of May 1768 and the Part B. Originally surveyed by said Mathews on the 2nd Day of the 5th mo 1770. in pursuance of the Application N^o 5387 for 150^{ac} Granted to said Mc Kinley bearing date the 27th Day of March 1779. Resurveyed and divided off from the two Larger tracts of Land on the 3rd Day of May A.D. 1815 — and at his request returned ^{for James Murraby the present owner} for ^{for Compensation} Jacob Spangler D.S. John Barnitz
