



In pursuance of a Warrant resurvey to me directed bearing date the 7<sup>th</sup> day of November 1763<sup>11</sup> requiring me to resurvey a certain Tract of Two hundred & fifty acres of land & allowance for roads &c. Originally laid out to William Allen Esq<sup>r</sup> & Company Proprietors of the Gap Copper Mine in the Township of \_\_\_\_\_ in the County of Lancaster & to include such Overplus as might have been included in the first Survey & also Three hundred acres adjoining the same with all overplus that might be in either or both of s<sup>d</sup> tracts and to make return of the whole Quantity & allowance &c into the Secretarys Office in order for Confirmation to the s<sup>d</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Allen Esq<sup>r</sup> & others to the s<sup>d</sup> Co- &c- Company &c. as by s<sup>d</sup> Warrant of resurvey will more fully app<sup>r</sup> & Now these may Certify that I did on the 6<sup>th</sup> 7<sup>th</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> 10<sup>th</sup> & 11<sup>th</sup> Day of September 1764 resurvey the s<sup>d</sup> two Tracts of land & inclu. &c such Overplus as was cleared of the Lines of the Claimers of adjoining lands & found the same to be situated in \_\_\_\_\_ Township in s<sup>d</sup> County of Lancaster. Beginning at an Old mark'd u &c Oak Tree standing on the East side of the Gap Mine run, extending thence by John Liggitts Land East twenty eight perches to another mark'd White Oak Thence South by the Three-hundred-acre Tract two hundred and twelve perches to a mark'd White Oak as above described - The O<sup>th</sup> Tract Beginning at a White Oak thence extending by the s<sup>d</sup> Mine Land South two hundred & five perches to a Spanish Oak thence by land of Nicholas Tract North eighty eight degrees East eighty seven perches to a post, &c as above described - Containing in the wh<sup>ol</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Seven hundred & eighty Acres & three Quarters & allowance of six p<sup>er</sup>ches for Roads &c
