



By virtue of a Warrant from Jacob Taylor Survey^r Gen^l to me directed bearing date the 22^d of 8th mo 1712. Pursuant to a Warr^t from the Commif^{rs} dated the 10th of 7th mo 1712 to survey unto Margery Nough Sarah Bainbridge & Rebecca Clow's four hundred acres of Land in the County of Bucks; Surveyed & laid out unto John Chapman Assignee of the s^d Margery Nough Sarah Bainbridge & Rebecca Clow's or their heirs three several tracts of Land in ^{Buckingham} Southerly townships in the s^d County; The first lying in Buckingham Begins at a heap of stones at George Waynroth's Corner, from thence running North West by Musgrove's Land one hundred perches to a Post. Then North East by Vacant Land two hundred & forty perches to a heap of stones by a White Oak. Then North West sixty perches to a small Hickory. Then North East fifty perches to a small black oak. Then South East one hundred & sixty perches to a Maple tree in the s^d Waynroth's Line. Then by the s^d Line South West two hundred & ninety perches to the place of Beginning containing two hundred acres; The second lies in Southerly & Begins at a small black oak in Cyra Crossdale's Line from thence running by the s^d Crossdale's & George Brown's Lands N.W. 261 perches to a black oak. Then by Vacant Land N.E. 92 perches to a heap of stones. Then S.E. 261 perches to a small Hickory in George Brown's Line. Then by the s^d Line S.W. 92 perches to the Beginning containing 150 acres; The third begins at a small Elm tree by Delaware River at the North side of Tohickan Creek, from running West over the s^d Creek 40 perches to a black oak. Then North by Vacant Land 264 perches to a small Hickory then by the London Company East 40 perches to a Hickory by the s^d River. Then down the s^d River S. 8th mo 80 perches. Then South 156 perches. Then S. 25th mo 30 perches to the Beginning containing Seventy four acres. Being in the whole four hundred acres with Allowance at 6 p Cent; according to Law. Laid out the 12th day of the 3rd month Aro Novy 1714.
