



A Draught of Two Tracts of Land Situate in Upper Milford Township in the County of Northampton (formerly Bucks.) and Province of Pennsylvania That were taken up by Hans Jacob Hoobler. By Two Warrants the first is dated on the 14th April 1743 and the second on the 25th ^{Octob^r} ~~May~~ 1746. (another Warrant of the 27th ^{May} 1745. is as I supposed for the 25th below) Both these Tracts Join Together. Containing One Hundred and fifty seven Acres and 106 Perches of Land together with the usual allowance at six percent for Roads. But no Body could show a division Line, and was therefore obliged to draw all in one Draught.

But since a Draught for the second Tract remains in the Office. So for the Remainder of the above a Draught may easily be made out as in Pursuance of the first Warrant.

Jacob Hoobler sold all the above to David Berringer who again to Benjamin Meyer for whom it was Resurveyed, and Drawn on the 16th September 1766.
