



Draught of a tract of land situate in the township of Braintown in the county of Luzerne and adjoining land surveyed for Richard Price containing one hundred ninety six acres, one hundred thirty two & three fourths perches of land besides the usual allowance &c. -- Surveyed in the year 1774 as appears by blocking the trees upon the ground and resurveyed the above tract of land for Benedict Dorsey the 7th day of October A. D. 1828 by virtue of his Warrant dated the 19th day of August 1773 and in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the Board of Property under the act of General Assembly of the 22nd of March 1820 entitled "An act directing the recovery of the principle and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of location and other Office titles, issued from under the Proprietary Government and for other purposes - and the supplement thereto, passed the 11th day of April, 1825. -- The tract of land under the shaded lines has been patented to Thomas Carney on a warrant issued to him the 25th day of May 1810, under whom John Carney now claims and who resides on the tract within the lines of Benedict Dorsey - thirty three acres & 33^{3/4} perches of Benedict Dorsey fall within the certified township of Putnam and now certified to J. Carney
