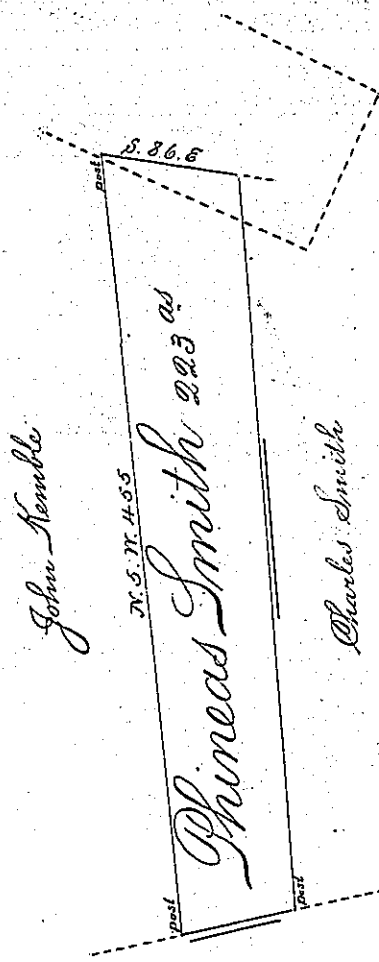

Situate on the Waters of the Frankstown Branch of Juniatta partly in Greenfield township Bedford County and partly in Huntingdon County containing two Hundred and twenty three acres and allowance of six per cent - Surveyed for Phineas Smith on order No 3647 dated the 8th day of May 1767
 To Jacob Spangler Esq. S. G. Daniel A. Guica D.S.

The dotted lines represent part of the draught of a tract of land surveyed for Phineas Buckley on order No 415 dated the 1st day of August 1766 - This tract interferes seven acres and one hundred and four perches with the Phineas Smith survey - Phineas Buckley conveyed to John Daynton, George Morgan & Samuel Wharton - John Daynton's interest was sold by the Sheriff of Huntingdon County to Michael F. Simpson - George Morgan conveyed to G. Benjaⁿ Wypcoop who conveyed to M. F. Simpson - Samuel Wharton's interest was sold to M. F. Simpson by Benjamin Wypcoop as Assignee of Saml Wharton - Michael F. Simpson appears to have abandoned his claim to the Interference - Phineas Smith sold to D^r Smith who devised to Charles Smith who sold to Joseph More the present owner.
