



Draft of a tract of land situate in Oakland Township Susquehanna County, Penn^a adjoining land actually owned & occupied by Ira W. Curtis & Niram Pooler on the north (which separate it from the New York State line) the Susquehanna River on the east - lands of Almon Barnes and John Fitzgerald on the South and the "Paymelot" so called or The Lowry Warrant on the West: Containing 255 acres & 142 perches and allowance of six per cent. Surveyed Oct. 16. 1867. in pursuance of a Warrant for J.P. & Chas. J. McKime (for 300 ac^s & all^r) dated Aug. 22^d 1867. The same being more particularly described in actual Survey as follows: Beginning at a heap of stones on the west bank of the Susquehanna river, being the S.E. corner of Niram Pooler's lot, Thence by said Pooler's and Ira W. Curtis lots North 84 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° West (actual course due west) 355 perches to a post & stones corner in the east line of a tract in the Warrant name of Thomas Lowry. Thence by the same (called the Paymelot) South 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° West (actual course S 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° E) 96 perches to a heap of stones for a corner. Thence by lands of John Fitzgerald & Almon Barnes South 76 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° East (real course S. 82° E) 294 perches to a post & stones corner. Thence by said Barnes lot North 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° East (real course N. 3° W) 38 perches to a post & stones corner. Thence by the same South 76 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° East (real course S. 82° E) 106 perches to stones on the river bank. Thence up the river bank N. 2° W. (really N. 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W.) 30 $\frac{1}{2}$ perches ^{to a chestnut tree} - N. 10° W. (really N. 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W.) 34 $\frac{1}{2}$ perches to a chestnut tree & N. 26 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W. (really N. 32° W.) 59 perches to the place of beginning -
