

In Council Philad^a Tuesday June 22nd 1790. — Upon the second reading of the Report of a Committee to whom was referred the petition of William Oren for the right of pre-emption to a certain Island lying in the Allegheny River about six miles below the mouth of Kiskiminetas River containing eighty four acres and six perches and the usual allowance of six acres per cent^d. It was resolved That the rights of pre-emption to the said Island be granted to the said William Oren — Provided that he pays for the same within six months from the Date hereof at the rate of 25 shillings per acre in funded Certificates of this State.
