



A Draught of a Tract of Land situated in Manchester Township in the County of York late part of the County of Lancaster containing Four Hundred and <sup>fourty eight</sup> ~~forty~~ Acres and <sup>145</sup> ~~140~~ Perches and the allowance of Six Acres p. Cent for Roads and Highways first surveyed the 8<sup>th</sup> day of October 1746 by Thomas Cookson Esq. late Deputy Surveyor of Lancaster County afterwards the 7<sup>th</sup> day of April 1752 by a certain William Brown in pursuance of two Warrants <sup>granted to John White</sup> the one bearing Date the 21<sup>st</sup> day of August 1744 the other bearing Date the 6<sup>th</sup> day of October 1748. The Lines examined protracted, calculated & divided agreeable to his share and the Overplus cut off the 7<sup>th</sup> day of September 1753 at the Request of Nicholas Warrman
