



A Draught of a Tract of Land situate in York Township in the county of York surveyed the 20th day of October 1761 at the special Instance of the Executors of Melchior Faulkner Deceased By George Stevenson Esq^r Deputy Surveyor of York County Excepting the small Piece within the Dotted Lines which was added to it to make it agreeable to the first survey Made to said Faulkner in pursuance of a Warrant bearing Date the 28th of October 1746 the copy Whereof was directed to Thomas Cookson Esq^r Surveyor of the County of Lancaster whose survey it is said was agreeable to the Black Lines the whole Containing One hundred and seventy three Acres and twenty nine Perches of Land with allowance of six Acres 10 Cent for Roads &c

I Baltzer Spangler ^{of York Town} being present at the first survey of the above described Tract of Land saith ^{upon his Oath before William Peters one of the Justices &c} that there was a straight line from A to B as above represented and that he was also present when the Dotted Line was run which was not agreeable to the first survey, but believes all the rest of the above & the 2^d Line as now made from A to B is agreeable to the first Survey of the 2^d Tract
