As Mr. Samuel Ewing has put into my hands two Warrants On dated November 5<sup>th</sup> 1745 for 100<sup>£</sup> & one dated the 10<sup>th</sup> day of September 1787 for 300<sup>£</sup> On Examination I find his Lands have been already Surveyed by my Brother Archibald and Recorded in his Book now in my possession as above Certific'd but Mr. Ewing informs me are returned — He has requested me to return 100<sup>£</sup> of the Original Survey which is represented by the dotted Line on the Draught, on the original Warrant, and the remaining 222 1/4 & the two small Draughts (one of 68 1/2 & the other of 28 1/2 Surveyed in right of John Thomson) on the new Warrant. — I have thought it my duty to transmit the matter just as it stands to you Sir that the Noble Board may take such measures as is Consistent with Justice to the State and Mr. Ewing
