A Draft of a Tract of Land Situate (formerly in Hopewell Township in the County of Lancaster) now in Peters Township in the County of Franklin containing nine hundred and seventy five acres & 106 Perches and the allowance of six p Cent for Roads &c<sup>d</sup> Resurvey<sup>d</sup> the 24<sup>th</sup> April 1796 (agreeable to a Draft signed George Stevens on said thereon to be "A true copy taken from a Draft found among the papers of Thomas Cookson Esq<sup>r</sup> on which Draft is indorsed in W<sup>o</sup> Cookson's hand writing 'Caveat against return of James Gardner by Robert Newall'") in pursuance of directions from the Surveyor General on an Order of the Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Board of Property granted the 9<sup>th</sup> February 1796 to the Petition of F<sup>o</sup> M<sup>o</sup> Mullan Gardner, who claims the Land by Virtue of a Warrant granted to James Gardner dated the 2<sup>nd</sup> Day of November 1742 - Of which Land the most northerly section containing 223 Acres & 79 p<sup>s</sup> & allowance is claimed by the Heirs of said Newall - the greatest part of what remains of said Land appears to have been Survey<sup>d</sup> to several later Warrants before any proof of the said old Warrant or Survey was brought forward - viz - one in the name of Walter W<sup>o</sup> Kinney granted 4<sup>th</sup> November 1785 and one other in the name of William Young Dated 15<sup>th</sup> March 1786 the surveys for which are probably return<sup>d</sup> - The owners of the two last mentioned Warrants were present and consented to the resurvey.
