



A Draught of a Tract of Land situate in Macetauney Township in the County of Berks and Province of Pennsylvania. Being Part of a Tract of 202 acres formerly Survey'd unto Andoss Fisher, whereof 93²cts are to be conveyed to Henry Metzstein, and 109 above described Part to remain for his son Anthony Fisher. Beginning at a Stone in the Line of Nicholas Kernan's Land Thence by the same and by Land of John Hartman South 10^{deg} East 88 perches to a Stone. Thence by the said Anthony Fisher's and Henry Metzstein's other Land, South 80^{deg} West 199 perches to a Stone. Thence by the said Henry Metzstein's Part of the said Land the following Courses and Distances 10 North 9^{deg} East 40 perches to a Stone. South 87^{deg} East 10 perches to a Stone. North 3^{deg} East 32 perches to a Stone. North 84^{deg} West 26 perches to a Stone. North 15^{deg} West 52 perches to a Stone. North 88^{deg} East 62 perches to a Stone. South 40^{deg} East 33 perches to a white oak Sapling. Thence by the same and by Lobd of John Hartman North 80^{deg} East 120¹/₂ perches to the Place of Beginning. Containing One Hundred and nine acres and forty Perches of Land together with the usual allowance at Six Per Cent for Roads. Resurveyed for the said Anthony Fisher on the 4th Day of May, Anno. 1763.
