Who by Deed - - bearing date the 20th day of December 1772 Conveyed the same to Turbutt Francis Esq. Who obtained a patent for Two thousand and thirty seven Acres and Ninety six perches bearing date the 24th day of February 1774. and also One other patent for the remaining One thousand & Sixty Acres and Sixty four perches bearing date on the 14th day of June 1774. And is to convey the same to the above mentioned persons according to the partition Lines laid down in the above Draft to wit To the Reverend William Smith and John Ledlie No. 6. Containing 200 Acres & allowance of Sixty Cent for roads. No. 8. Containing 130 Acres & allowance of 131 Acres & Cent. No. 17. Containing 163 Acres & allowance No. 18. No. 6 & 8. are part of the 2037^{ac} 96^{rs} patent And No. 14 & 17 are part of the 1064^{ac} 64^{rs} patent
