



Situate in Manheim Township Schuylkill County Containing 131<sup>ad</sup> 126 perches and the usual allowance. It being the Remainder of a larger survey made on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of September A.D. 1754 by Virtue of a Warrant Granted to Samuel Thompson dated the 4<sup>th</sup> of March 1750 which said Survey was Returned to the Surveyor General's Office on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of October 1754 for 237<sup>ad</sup> and allowance, a warrant was also Granted unto a Certain Jacob Rust, dated the 14<sup>th</sup> day of November 1752 and a survey made by Virtue thereof as Represented in the above diagram by the Red line including said Rusts Improvement, and by a decision afterwards had in law it was adjudged that Rusts Claim within the said Red lines should be good and valid, against Thompsons Warrant and Survey, and it appears also that part of the said Rust Survey is since Patented to Ludwig Berger, Surveyed the 9<sup>th</sup> of February A.D. 1769
