



Situate on the waters of Redstone Creek in Wharton township Fayette County & Surveyed the 23rd day of May 1795. In pursuance of a warrant dated the 12th day of March 1794 per Alexander McClean D. 551.

The above is a corrected copy of the survey sent you on the 23rd of Nov. 1839, made by one of my predecessors, and returned by you with orders for correction. The line A. B. in the original calls for 202.8 perches. But comparing it with the William James Survey, it appears evident that it should be 193. The line G. H. I have corrected by an actual survey made by myself some years ago on the Jeremiah Guard tract, and the lines between J. & O. I have corrected by copying from surveys I myself have made on the McKissock & Carver tracts. The land lies in what is now Union township. I refer you again to the clause in my first return relative to there having been a resurvey made under Freeman Lewis at the request of William Danner, which resurvey does materially alter the above.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this

seventh day of November 1899.
