



Situated on the Waters of Youghio Gene River on the West side thereof about 4 Miles from Stewards Crossings in Franklin Township Fayette County & Surveyed the 26th Day of October 1786 by virtue of a Certificate granted by the Virginia Commissioners of which the following is a Copy.
 Commonwealth of Virginia. To Wit
 Ohio County, Ss.

The following is a Copy of a Certificate I find Entered on Col^d William Craufords Books, which may be further Authenticated by comparing it with the List of Entries in Each of the Surveyors hands, of the Counties of Fayette, Westmoreland and Washington.

Feb^y 9th 1780 This day Mathew Neily Produced a Certificate from the Commissioners Appointed to grant Lands in Yohogania Monongalia & Ohio, in These Words:

We the Com^{rs} appointed to settle Titles and grant Lands in the Counties of Monongalia Yohogania & Ohio. Do hereby Certifie that Mathew Neily is intitled to one hundred and fifty Acres of Land on the Waters of Yohogania River in Yohogania County so Included in Improvement made in the Year 1772 Also To the Pre-emption of one thousand Acres adjoining thereto given under our hands at Redstone old fort the 7th day of Feb^y 1780. And in the fourth Year of the Commonwealth.
