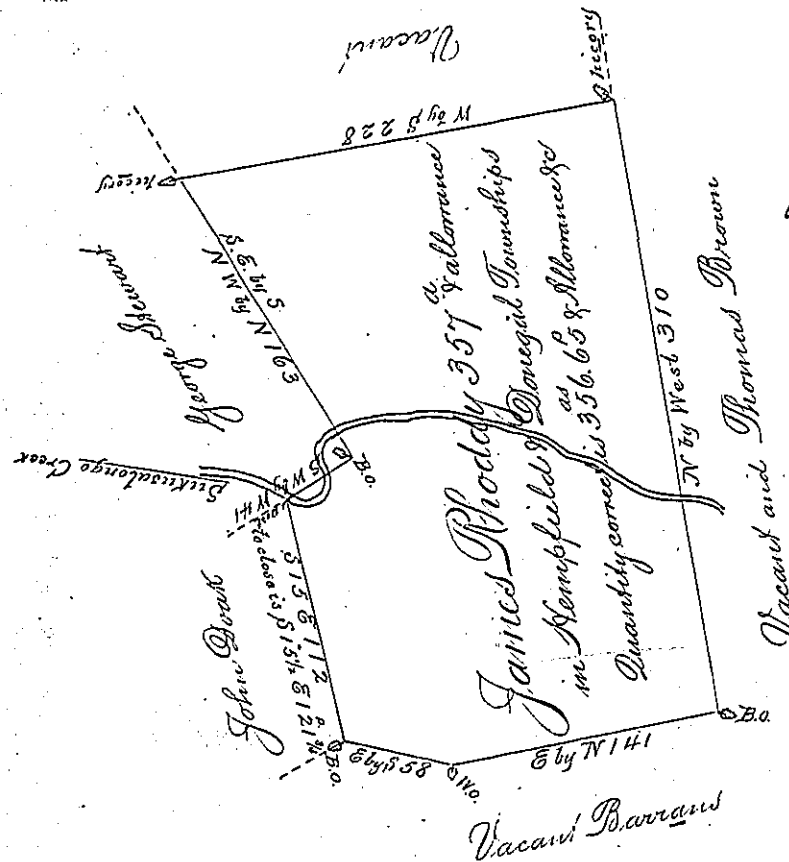

By Order of the Proprietary Surveyd to James Rhoady a Tract of Land in the Townships of Newfield & Donegal in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a Black Oak on the Barrans thence by Vacant Land & the Land of Thomas Brown North by West three hundred & ten perches to a hickory thence by Vacant Land thence by South 170 & 20 & 28 acres to a hickory thence by the Land of George Stewart ^{South East by South} one hundred & fifty three perches to a Black Oak thence continuing by the ^{South West} S^d Stewarts Land South West by West ^{forty one} perches to a post thence by the Land of John Doak South fifteen Deg. ^{& a half} East one hundred & ^{twenty one} ^{& three quarters} perches to a Black Oak thence East by South fifty eight perches to a White Oak thence by Vacant Barrans East by North one hundred forty one perches to the place of Beginning containing three hundred & fifty seven acres with the usual allowance
