



Hans Groff of Lancaster County hath a Patent for 1419^a beside y^e Allowance in One Tract. For two of his Sons he had Sur^d off the same about 419^a on the West part thereof, about 200^a for another of his Sons on y^e East & 100^a on y^e N. E. Corner for his Daughter, (or her Assigns) the two first Tracts for his Sons was Surveyed by Zachary Butcher, the last by J. N. C. On the 29th of 3rd mo last he desired me to make a small alteration of y^e line that cut off y^e 200^a on the East, and to Survey the Remaining Part of his Land, for he thought he wanted of the Measure, which I did as appears above and Computed it to Contain 608^a & all. But for more than a Week past I have been so much indisposed that I cannot sit any Considerable time, Nor Trust y^e y^e above Computations is Exact. If thou would please to examine it, I will be an additional kindness to me. If the Whole Tract or part of the Complement Granted by Pat^t he Intends to apply for y^e Necessary Addition, whilst Tract Land is contiguous I am thy Tr^d
