

Allegheny County and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania:

On the 11th day of August Anno Domini 1806 before Richard Richardson

Esq^r one of the Commonwealth's Justices of the peace and for the County of Allegheny aforesaid, personally came George Vallandigham, or his attorney Oath deposed and said, that by order of Mess^{rs} Guesley

Neill and Matthew Pickie Esq^rs that he the said deponent, did on the 11th day of February 1787 execute a conveyance of a tract of land on the West side of

Frederick creek for Daniel Swearingen containing three hundred and three rods and fourteen perches and afterwards granted to

Daniel Swearingen, dated September the 8th 1785, and at the same time the deponent further said, that he executed a conveyance for Samuel Moore,

adjoining the tract he conveyed for the said Daniel Swearingen, which conveyance, for the said Samuel Moore did contain three hundred and ninety

three rods and fourteen perches and afterwards by mistake or oversight, he returned the conveyance executed for the said Daniel Swearingen

in the name of Samuel Moore and the conveyance executed for Samuel Moore in the name of Daniel Swearingen, the name of the said Samuel Moore was executed on a warrant in the name of Henry Wilson — The above is a true statement to the best of the

deponent's knowledge sworn and subscribed, this day and year above mentioned, before
