



Resurveyed for Edward H. Fisher on the 16th day of December A.D. 1856. Situated in Halifax Township, Dauphin County, Pennsylvania, containing 114 acres 90 perches and allowances, being part of a larger tract of 439 acres and allowances, which was surveyed for James Black on the 14th day of December, 1801, in pursuance of his warrant, dated the 27th November, 1801. According to the case of Galbreath vs. Black, 4th Sergeant and Rawl's Reports, Page 207, James Black claimed the whole of the 439 acres and allowance by virtue of an improvement settlement, made by him in May, A.D. 1771.
