



In Pursuance of a Warrant from the Prop^{rs} dated the Ninth day of February Anno Domini 1737 Survey'd unto Joseph Baker on the 11th of April then next ensuing a Certain Tract of Land situate in Marlborough Township in the County of Chester Beginning at a white Oak at a corner of Jacob Taylor & Thomas Cox's land thence East North East by the Land of the s^d Cox and Land deeded by Magnus Tabe 111 pches to a White Oak thence South 21st East by the s^d Tabe's Land 27 pches to a post and East North East 20 pches to a post Thence South 27th East by the land of William Barkan 29.3 pches to a post thence South South West by the same Land 74 pches to a post thence North 21st Westerly by the Land of John Taylor 32 1/2 pches to a White Oak thence West South West by the same Land 110 pches to a White Oak thence North North West by the s^d Jacob Taylor's Land 48 pches to the place of Beginning Containing one Hundred Acres and the usual Allowance for Roads
