



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Dated the 12th day of May 1732 Survey'd unto the Honourable Thomas Penn Esq^r a tract of land situate on the River Susquehanna in Lancaster County. Beginning at a Water Beech by the Sth River at a corner of John Harris's Land thence East north East by the same two Hundred & fifty two pches to an Elm Tree thence North by Vacant land one Hundred & twenty pches to a Black Oak Thence North by East by Vacant land two Hundred and Eighty pches to a Black Oak Thence North West by Vacant Land One Hundred pches to a Chestnut Oak thence West by North three Hundred & Eighty pches to a Black Oak by the Sth Susquehanna River then down the same Six Hundred and Eighty pches to the place of Beginning Containing One thousand acres and the Allowance of six acres p Cent
