The greater part of the Ninety seven acres and thirty perches is part of a Survey made for John Dorsius as above Stated. Both Surveys for Koster & Dorsius said to have been made the one on the 16<sup>th</sup> the other on 17<sup>th</sup> October 1769 and then Situate in Bedford County Pa
