That part where the letter A is placed in the above Diagram Represented by the Red lines Containing as above set forth 80^{ac} & 31 perches and allowances Being part of a larger Tract of 138^{ac} & allowances which was Originally Surveyed by John Churchman on the 30th of the 8th month 1744 In Pursuance of a Warrant Granted to William Graydon bearing date the 2^d day of November A.D. 1741. The part B Represented by Yellow lines Containing as above set forth 56^{ac} & 116 perches and allowances. Being part of a larger Tract of 314^{ac} & 50 perches and allowances &c which was originally Surveyed by Thomas Armer and afterwards Resurveyed on the 22^d day of the 10th Month 1765 by William Matthews later D. C. for Newry Council. In pursuance of a Warrant for 150^{ac} granted to Mathew Payne dated the 20th day of March 1758 Resurveyed and Divided off from the said larger Tracts of Land on the 9th day of April A.D. 1799 And now at the request of the present owner James Quisenberry the above has been Calculated examined and Corrected the 25th day of November A.D. 1809. who desired me to return the same for Confirmation.
