

The above is a Draught of a Resurvey made February 20<sup>th</sup> 1829 (at the request of Daniel Moore) in pursuance of a<sup>of Property</sup> Order of the Board, Dated July 11<sup>th</sup> 1829 situate in Finley Township Washington County, and part in Green County, on the waters of Wheeling Creek, Containing Four hundred and sixty eight Acres and 120 perches strict measure, name Doctors Hall.

It appears from the County Survey Book in my office Page 67 that a Survey was made on the above November 13<sup>th</sup> 1785 for Dr Henry Moore, in pursuance of James Hunsiders Survey Entry in the Ohio County Virginia, Surveyors Book of Entries, Entry made June 9<sup>th</sup> 1781 Content 400 Acres.

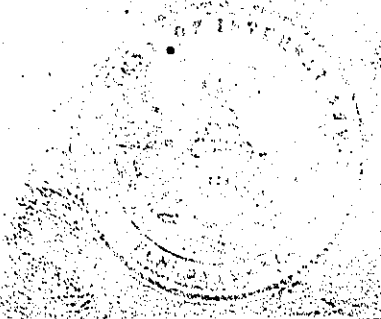
Note at the time of the Survey the old lines were plainly marked and followed all but the line from the Sugar tree to the Beginning Wok which calls for one line on the old Survey but Richard Sergeant when taking up Vacant land, run, and marked the lines as above, the old Survey was erroneous both in Courses & Distances.
