



Stiner (Now S. Colleen)

On the 9th day of November 1848 (being then County Surveyor for Clarion County) I made an official Survey of the above described tract of land situate in Limestone (formerly Clarion) Township Clarion (formerly Armstrong) County Pa. Containing sixty acres and seventy one perches & allowance of six per cent. In pursuance of a warrant dated the 12th day of March 1839, granted to Rob^t Barber for eighty acres of unimproved land in Clarion Tp. Armstrong County bounded on the West by Jas. Williams on the North by Jno Jones & Philip — on the East by Jacob Roseg & Fox & on the South by Hugh Maguire and by him conveyed to James W Guthrie at whose instance I made the survey.

Note. The warrant in question was not put into my hands until the 6th day of June 1862, it having been lost or mislaid, I was however notified of its existence and swore my chain carriers accordingly. The adjoining lands seem to have changed owners since the date of the Warrant.
