The Reason of this Representation of the Draughts around the piece Marked A is That the Heirs of John Least says that the Warrant for 50^a Wherean 107 1/2 a is Surveyed Ought also to take the said 15 1/2 a which is Surveyed to Bruchs Warrant and Declares they will Dispute the same before the Board, this Information from the Leases Induced me to lay down the lands of Both Parties along with the Return in Order that the Honorable Board might have the least Trouble Possible with the Dispute.
