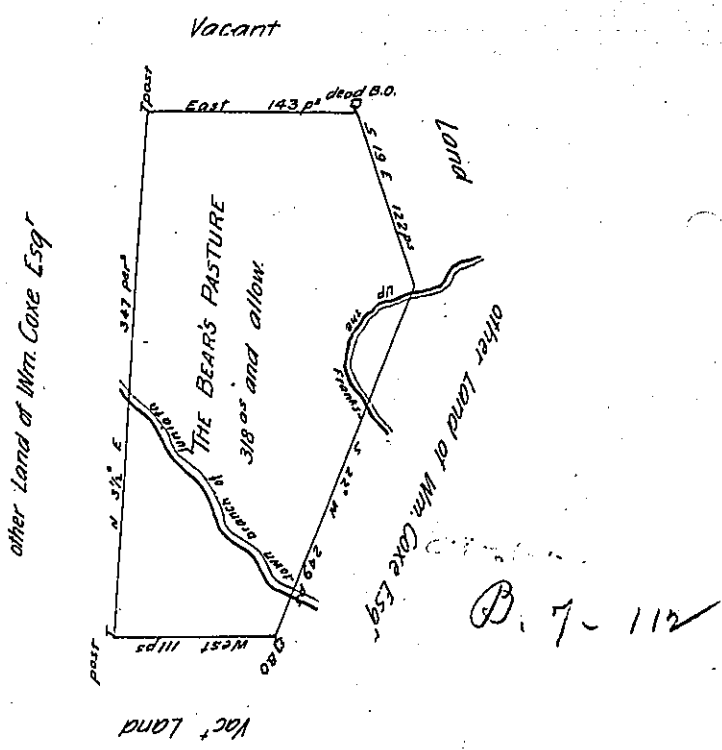
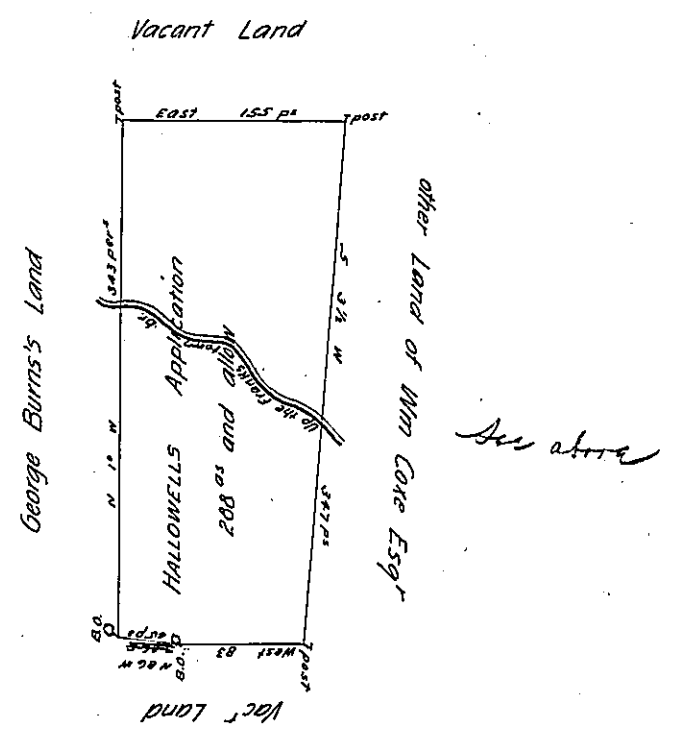

In pursuance of a Warrant dated the 12<sup>th</sup> day of December 1765 Surveyed the 18<sup>th</sup> day of April 1767 for William Coxo Esq<sup>r</sup> the above described tracts of land situate on the Frankstown branch of Juniata River in the County of Cumberland one of them called Hallowells application containing two hundred and eighty eight acres and the usual allowance of 6 p Ct, and the other called the Bears pasture containing three hundred and eighteen acres and the like allowance for Roads as afores<sup>d</sup>.
