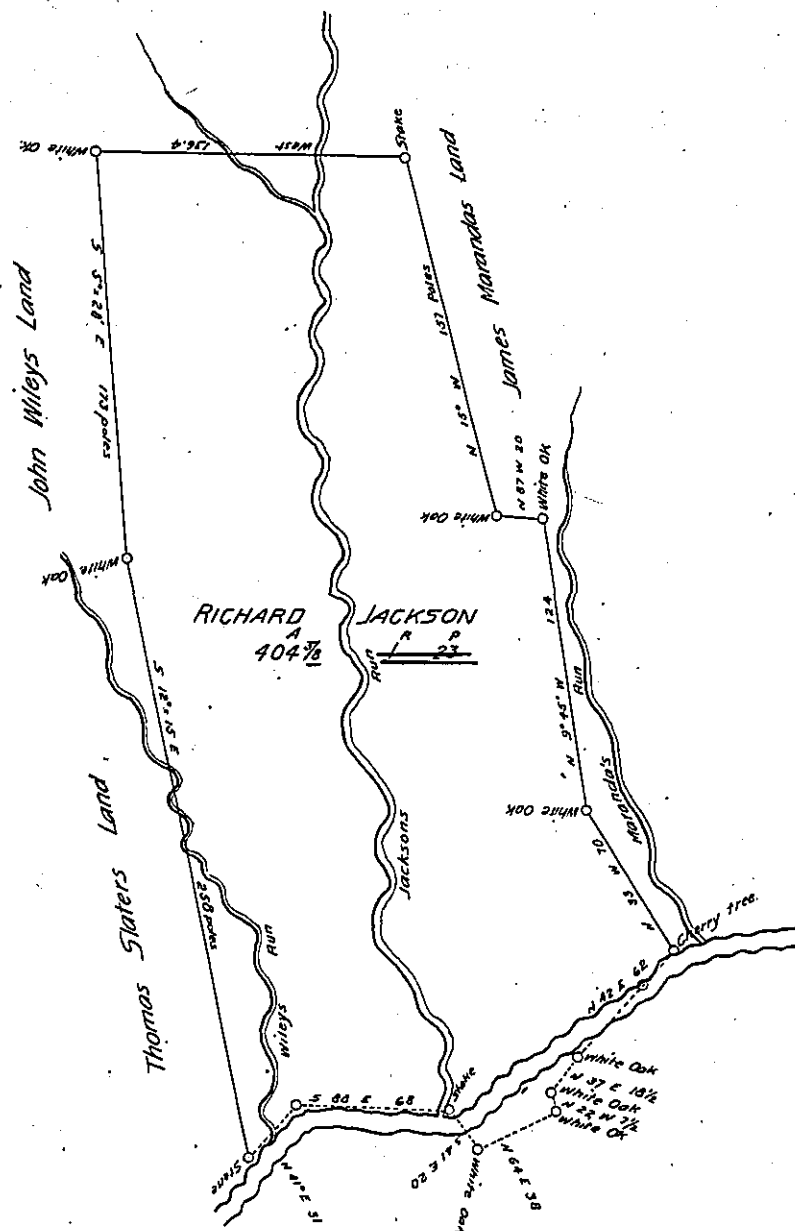

The above is a Draught of Land on the South Fork of Ten Mile Creek including Jackson's fort Called Danger. Containing Four Hundred and four Acres one Rood and Twenty Three perches. Survey^d Feb^r 8th 1785 for Richard Jackson on a Virginia Certificate as follows Viz.

We the Commissioners appointed for adjusting the Claims to unpatented Land in the Counties of Monongalia Yokogania and Ohio do hereby Certify that Richard Jackson is entitled to four hundred Acres of Land in the County of Monongalia Situate and lying on the South fork of Ten Mile Creek to include his settlement made in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy five, also a Right in preemption to one hundred acres adjoining thereto.

Given under our hands at Red Stone Old fort this 18th Day of November 1779 in the fourth year of the Commonwealth
