



Draught of an Island called "Matlack's Island" situate in the River Delaware near the upper end of League Island in the County of Philadelphia in the State of Pennsylvania. Beginning at a Stake in the range of the middle of a Sluice Ditch on the Pennsylvania Shore which Ditch bears from the said place of beginning N 20° W and the Point House bears from the same place N 44° 45' E thence by the channel which divides this from the upper end of League Island N 89° 45' E 62 perches thence by the main channel of the said River Delaware N 66° 45' E 20 perches and N 46° 40' E 112 perches thence by the channel which divides this and League Island from Land of the Widow Marshall and others S 88° 15' W 34 perches and S 56° 45' W 152 1/2 perches to the place of Beginning Containing 27 acres and 39 perches strict measure Surveyed Nov' 12th 1813 in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Robert Brooke dated the 2 day of March A. D. 1812.
