



The above is a Draught of a Survey made May 22<sup>d</sup> 1827, in pursuance of a Warrant granted to John Alexander, dated May 1<sup>st</sup> 1827, for two acres of land, but contains seventy Acres and 115 perches, and Allowance of six per cent for highways, situate in East Bethlehem Township, Pa. On the above land there is an actual settlement, and has been improved ~~and~~ for about 41 years. It appears from an old Draught in the possession of John Alexander, that a survey has been made on the whole of the above land, in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Edward Dammus, for 40 acres, dated March 8<sup>th</sup> 1786, Surveyed Sept. 30<sup>th</sup> 1787, containing 100<sup>th</sup> Acres & Allowance, the D. S. name not signed, but directed to John Lukins Esq. D. C. Pa. It also appears that John Bowers, Esq. got a Patent, for the part enclosed by the dotted lines, but why he did not embrace the whole is what I do not know.
