 We the Commissioners for adjusting Claims to unpatented lands in the Counties of <sup>Monongalia</sup> ~~Monongalia~~ <sup>Yohogania</sup> ~~Yohogania~~ and Ohio, do hereby Certify that John McLaughlin is intitled to four Hundred acres of land in Yohogania County on the Waters of Redstone to include his actual settlement made in the Year one thousand seven hundred and seventy one, Also a right in Preemption to four Hundred acres adjoining thereto Given Under our Hands at Coxes Fort the seventh day of February 1780 in the fourth year of the Commonwealth
