A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in Monaghan Township in the County of York Resurveyed the 15th day of June 1790 by the lines formerly run by Charles Lukens D.S. In Pursuance of an Application To John Pawling Dated the 19th day of March 1767 ^{N-3100} Containing Two Hundred and Eighteen Acres and 5/8 and allowance of Six p Cent for Roads & p-John Forsyth D.S.

N.B. The Yellow lines is the Copy of a draught which the late Charles Lukens Returned Into the Surveyor Genl's Office which he returned on the aboves application, But when I came on the Ground found that the said Return ~~but~~ is Exhibited by Yellow lines is Very Erroneous by Taking a part of the above Survey where the letter A Stands and also a part of John Calhoons Land where the letter B Stands Calhoons is also Returned.

The lines from the Dead Sassafras Marked thus * To the B.D. Near the Run is the Standing lines Between Benjamin Elliot and Henry Persoon for upwards of Twenty Years Therefore the return made of the Yellow lines by Lukens must be Cancelled. The Black lines is the True Draught for Pawlings Application.
