



By virtue of a warrant granted to Cornelius Lowe dated 15th June A.D. 1848 - on the 17th & 18th of November 1848 & 26th 27th 28th & 30th of April & 1st & 3rd days of May A.D. 1849 Surveyed to Cornelius Lowe the above described tract of land containing three hundred and eight acres and allowance of Six per cent Situate in the township of West Mahoning in the County of Indiana adjoining lands Surveyed upon a warrant granted to Herman LeRoy and others on the South and lands of Biddle and Meason on the north containing an improvement upon which the widow and heirs of Henry Roush dead reside and occupy.
