



By virtue of a Warrt. from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries bearing Date the Second Day of February Anno Dom/1737 I have Surveyed and Laid out unto William Cooper in the Township of Pennsborough in the County of Lancaster On the West Side Susquehanna River Three hundred and Twenty five acres <sup>and a half</sup> of Land With allowance of 6 p. Cent. Beginning at a (obl)panish Oak a Corner of William Bayleys Land Thence North Twenty Degrees Easterly Two hundred pches to a Post Thence North Seventy Degrees Westerly Two hundred and thirty six perches to a Post a Corner of Thomas Fultons Land thence by the same Land South Twenty Degrees Westerly Three hundred perches to a Post Standing in the Line of Robert Mills's Land Then by the Same Land South Seventy Degrees Easterly Eighty pches to a White Oak Standing in the Line of William Bayleys Land and by the Same Land North Twenty Degrees Easterly one hundred pches to a White Oak Thence South Seventy Degrees Easterly One hundred and fifty six perches to the place of Beginning
