


Situate in Dover Township in the County of York. That part Included within the lines where the Letters of the alphabet are Placcd, represents the Land as surveyed on the 4th. day of June A^o D^o 1804. In Pursuance and agreeably to the Order of the Board of Property of Penns. dated the 1st. day of May Last, and Contains agreeably to Calculation 119a. & 7perches and allowance &c. And that part in the above diagram where this  mark is placed represents a Vacancy on which a Certain Troastle has this Last Spring erected a small Cabbin and Cleared a small Patch of Ground, and from Information appears now to have abandoned it. However John Leather for whom the Order of the Board has been executed, is desirous of having it added to the Original Survey, formerly made by William Mathews late D.S. in addition to that already mentioned, and the said Leather also states that he expected to have the whole added agreeable to the Order of the Board, for which he is willing to pay the Purchase money and Interest from the time the Original Warrant for 100a. dated the 6th. day of January A.D. 1772 was Granted to his Father Frederick Leather, under whom the said John Leather Claims the said Land. Containing in the whole (Excepting the 223a. Tract) Including the two Vacancies above set forth 138a. & 69ps. and allowance &c.
