

On the 2nd of November 1803 | went to execute the order of the Board to me directed dated the 13th of October 1803, directing me to resurvey William Johnston's Tract on the Petition of James Massey agreeably to the lines marked on the Ground — The Piece including the letter A was taken in when William Johnston's Warrant was executed — and was struck off by Mr. Woods — before it was returned and is now included in a survey made on a Warrant to Serah Massey dated the 7th Day of August 1793 surveyed the 11th Day of December 1793 and patented the 28th of May 1796 and is claimed by Judge Gloninger & Company owners of the Huntingdon Furnace — who have requested me to state their claim. When I made the survey on the 20th of May 1785 after running 310 Perches from the Pine now down to B, I stopped, but before it was returned the Line was extended from B. to the Post, from whence a Line was plotted to the Post at C, a corner of James Worrel & John Evens, where I began W. Johnston's survey.
