Situated on a Branch of Redstone Creek that empties into the same a little below Union Town in Union Township Fayette County & Surveyed the 21st Day of February 1784 In pursuance of an order of Survey N^o 3246 Dated the 20th Day of May 1769. & Resurveyed the 20th day of June 1787 for the purpose of Conforming with a Judgment Obtained March Session 1787 in favour of the Rev^d John Todd & as well to distinguish an interference of James Kindle Senior made by Consent of parties & in Order to Regulate the whole so that patent may Issue, should the Honorable Board judge in favour of the Right of Isabella M^cCleary against the Claims of the ^{other} Settlers represented in the former Return.

Note ----- On Resurveying this Tract I found the Measurements to differ from that of the former either through some Error in the Chain or the Artifice of the bearers, which was so regularly performed that it could not be discovered, for the Survey Closed exceedingly well. —
