



Situate in the River Susquehanna, in the Township of Conestogoe and County of Lancaster, Surveyed in Pursuance of a Warrent dated the tenth day of November 1803 granted to John Kindig and Philip Urban, the Courses and distances are as follows Vizt: Beginning at this ~~Mark~~ Mark in the above diagram, thence South Eighty one degrees East fourteen perches, thence down the River South fifteen degrees East ten perches, North eighty one degrees West fourteen perches, thence up s^d River North fifteen degrees West ten perches to the Place of Beginning Containing three quarters of an acre of Land & allowance of six pr Ct. "Caled Willow Island" being - Between Eshleman's Falls and Conestogoe Island and about two-and fifty yards below an Island (said) Improved by George + ~~Philip~~ Lewis Urban & Israel Nestelroth -
