



The Draughts of two pieces of Land Situate in East Pennsborough Township Cumberland County Containing as appears by the above Draughts (Viz) N^o 1 Eighty-seven Acres and 112 Perches. N^o 2 Sixty-five Acres and 39 Perches and Allowance Containing in (obliterated) One hundred and fifty two Acres and 151 Pe (obl) Allowance of Six Cent for Roads &c Surveyed May 22nd 1793 in pursuance of an Order of Survey to Edward Morton N^o 2748 Dated February 11th 1767, said two pieces being part of a Tract formerly Surveyed in pursuance (obl.) the Above recited Order, but afterwards cut apart by Order of the Honorable Board of Property in favor of Mar (obl) Harmin, in Right of John Douglass as appears by the Dotted lines which connected them together, Reference being th(obl) had to the Determination of the Board
